June has been quite a month! I arrived in Zambia and after a couple of days to organise the house and vehicle, it was straight into work planning for July and August. I am currently visiting our ECD centres in Livingstone and Mazabuka. In Livingstone we have 2 new teachers so I have to start from scratch again helping them to understand learning through play. In Mazabuka we only have one untrained teacher at present so we are trying to find another teacher. There are many challenges but the teachers remain focused and the children are really enjoying coming to both centres.

In July I will travel to Chipata to spend a week with our ECD centre in Muchini where teachers have little support locally so they need a lot of encouragement. I will also travel to Kabushi in the Copperbelt region of Zambia to see the progress of our ECD centre which is being built.

August will be busy too – I have a week of teacher training when teachers from Southern, the Copperbelt, Chipata and Lundazi will come together for a week of training. As soon as it is finished, I travel to Malawi for the CCAP 100-year celebrations. The last week of August is our Synod meeting which will be in Livingstone where we have key elections this year.

In the midst of all this, it is wonderful to see God at work in CCAP Synod of Zambia.
